

DESIGN FOR A MANDOLIN-BODY.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM J. F. SCHULTZ, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Mandolin-Bodies, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

In the drawings: Figure 1 is a front face view and Fig. 2 is a side elevation, showing my new design.

The improved body has a cylindrical lower portion a and an upper portion comprising rounded angular corners b and corners c above the corners b. The front face of the body is provided with S-shaped openings d. I claim:

The ornamental design for a mandolin body, as shown.
