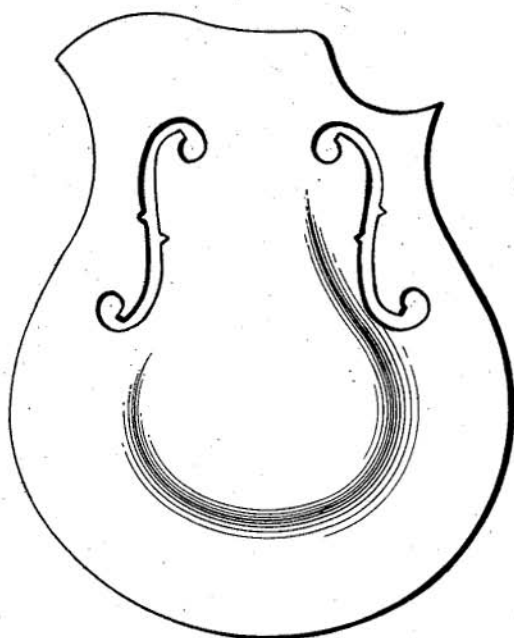

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALBERT SHUTT, a citizen of the United States, residing at Topeka, in the county of Shawnee and State of Kansas, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Bodies for Stringed Musical Instruments, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 shows the design of the body of a stringed musical instrument in front elevation; Fig. 2 is an edge view thereof.
