



HESSE AND WILLIAMS.

AT THE COLISEUM.

The attraction at the Coliseum beginning with tonight and lasting to and including the rest of the week, exclusive of the high grade pictures, will be Hesse and Williams, instrumentalists.

Messrs. Hesse and Williams have been together in the theatrical profession for fifteen years. The instruments they play are of the finest made. The harp, guitar, lyre and mandolin are a feature in themselves. They were made by the famous for-

ein harp maker, C. Knudsen, of Seattle, formerly of Stockholm, Sweden. The harp guitar has 19 strings and Mr. Williams is the only man who has the thorough knowledge of handling this mammoth instrument. The banjos used by Hesse and Williams are of solid silver and gold and are valued very highly as they are the last made by the famous professional banjo maker before he died, J. B. Schall, and were his last triumphant effort. This is the only act of its kind that does not use an orchestra to help it satisfy its audience.
